These books are all picture books with no text. These books are great for making up a story or asking questions about what is happening in the pictures. In each book there is guidance about how parents might use the story with their children.

These books have some simple 3 sound words that you can practise reading with your child if they are not yet ready to read a whole book or sentence.

These are simple sentence books which contain lots of sounds that we have learned so far in our phonics. They will be a good way to practise those sounds again. To help the children we say "say the sounds, read the word". Or, if it is an unfamiliar word, we say "that word says ____"

These books all have familiar sounds in with some words that may be more of a challenge to the children. They may just be stories you'd like to read to your child and use some 'book talk' questions to talk about the stories.

The sounds we have learned so far in Cherry, Beech and Oak classes are:

a, i, m, s, t, n, p, o, b, c, g, h,
d, f, v, e, k, l, r, u, j, r

The high-frequency words we have learned so far in Cherry, Beech and Oak classes are:

is, a, the, I, of, was
