Covid-19 End of Autumn term update

Dear Parents and Carers,

As you know, at this time the school still remains in an Enhanced/Amber COVID position. This continues to be as a result of the impact from the wider community and the most recent announcements this week, following the arrival of the new Omicron variant. Within our own setting across the term the number of positive cases has remained very low.

At any time we have had no more than a couple of families out of school and currently we have a healthy staff. Thank you for supporting us with our current adjustments to the school day, they are working to keep the whole community well. As of today, there will be no changes to any of our timings and when we return to school in January we will stay working in our year group bubbles and continue to find alternative ways to hold whole school events. Drop off and collection times will stay as they are and we will also continue to ask you to adhere to the one way system that we have through the grounds and if you can wear a face mask when inside the school grounds.

All of our previous measures will remain in place and those that apply to the normal school day also apply to before and after school care. This will continue as it has done up until now.

The guidance is here for you with an update on the Omicron variant.

This may include the use of CO2 devices to measure sufficient ventilation in settings where available.</p> <p>One-off enhanced cleaning focusing on touch points and any shared equipment Review and reinforcement of hygiene measures</p>	
Enhanced/Amber	<p>Introduce face coverings for staff in communal areas such as corridors when movement occurs between lessons and on school transport if used</p> <p>Reduce mixing between groups of children as much as possible. Consider pausing 'whole school' assemblies and other "large gatherings"</p> <p>Promote social distancing and reduce crowding where possible; minimise pinch points in the school day, for example, staggered lunch times, or start times</p> <p>Reinforce social distancing and good infection prevention control amongst staff (ventilation and touchpoint cleaning especially in areas where staff gather)</p> <p>Updated guidance: any close contacts of confirmed cases of Covid-19 identified by NHS Test & Trace to book a PCR test and whilst awaiting test results, undertake a daily LFD test and only attend school if this is negative. All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will continue to be required to self-isolate and asked to book a PCR test. The Government plans to introduce Daily Contact Testing as soon as possible as an alternative to self-isolation for contacts of positive Omicron cases who are fully vaccinated or under the age of 18 years and 6 months.</p> <p>The daily LFD testing is at the parent or guardian's discretion for primary age children.</p> <p>Additional Actions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At lunch time there will be no lunch club, tree house or risky play available. No visitors unless essential to undertake assessment or work. Office closed to visitors unless essential parents to email or telephone. Staff Face masks/screens/ distanced working. Shared spaces e.g. library, Willow room to be fogged regularly. No whole school assembly. Staff meetings to take place over teams. Where possible intervention groups to be made up of children from the same classes. Tables, chairs, classroom furniture and touch points to be regularly cleaned.
