The **Summer Reading Challenge** takes place over the summer holidays throughout the UK. Run by national charity **The Reading Agency**, and delivered with the support of the **UK public library network**, it is the UK's biggest free reading promotion for primaryaged children.

The Challenge reaches over **700,000 families** each year, motivates children to keep reading during the summer holidays, and helps them to maintain their reading skills and confidence.

Available online and through public libraries, the Challenge provides fun **reading for pleasure** activities for all abilities and helps to prevent the summer reading 'dip' during the long break from school.

This year's theme is 'Wild World Hero's' and is focused on the amazing animals that we have on planet earth. Children can earn rewards and certificates in return for their reading. Mrs Shakesby is a library volunteer and you might see her if you pop into the library to take part in the challenge. Remember, picture books will count towards this, children do not need to be fluent readers to meet the challenge. Enjoying and talking about books shared with an adult is part of building successful reading.

Pupil Premium and Sports Premium Budgets

Dear Parents and Carers

As maybe aware schools are funded by a Government Grant on the number of children which attend and that funding is used to pay for all of the staffing, resources, materials and running costs at the school. At Hindhayes, we are always striving to ensure that we are maximising the budget so that we have the resources needed to provide the best teaching and learning experience and positive outcomes for your child. However, there are 2 areas of the budget (Pupil and Sports Premium) which rely on families completing a simple form, which can generate additional income for the school.

Please can we ask you to complete a Pupil Premium form (https://www.hindhayes.co.uk/ attachments/download.asp?file=1536&type=pdf) or contact the Office on Hindhayes@educ.somerset.gov.uk where we can send you a copy. For each eligible child this will generate an additional £1,320 per year so will really make a difference to the school.



Please remember that you must book at least 7 days in advance for Wrap Around Care. We do this so that we can have the correct amount of staff and food prepared.


