They have all completed the two reading tasks. These have tested their stamina in their reading, their phonic skills as well as their ability to comprehend and infer from what they have read. The first paper was about farming and required the children to think about some interesting and in some cases unfamiliar vocabulary e.g. how many children know what a miller is? All of the children have tackled the booklets with resilience and shown a great maturity and sense of responsibility within their learning.
